According to Genero Communications, Made-in-TT is the first initiative of its kind to be launched in the Caribbean. The Export Import Bank of Trinidad and Tobago (Exim Bank) in collaboration with Genero Communications has developed an online market space for Trinidad and Tobago's goods and service providers. The website provides local businesses with a platform to showcase their products to the global market of buyers with the ultimate objective of generating increased sales via export driven sales orders. One of the most notable benefits of such a platform is the ability of manufacturers and service providers alike to generate foreign exchange through the ability to engage in commercial relations with the global market. 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E-Goods Declaration Module of TTBizlink

The MTIIC has announced that the e-Goods declaration module on TTBizLink Website has been launched and is now accessible for use by Licensed Customs Brokers and Clerks. This facility enables an Importers and Exporters, or authorized agents of imported goods who have submitted an electronic customs declaration (e-C82) to the Customs Border Control System (Asycuda World) to obtain regulatory approvals/endorsements from the relevant national regulatory agencies. Services go Global: The Roadmap for Exporting Services

On November 24, 2014 Trinidad and Tobago Coalition of Service Industries (TTCSI) delivered a presentation on the **Services Go Global** initiative. This is a new and exciting service being delivered in the Caribbean by the Caribbean Network of Service Coalitions (CNSC). It is geared towards guiding service exporting companies through the development of their export plan. The roadmap is divided into four (4) stages, which focus on preparing business to export their services (Stage 1), conducting the necessary market research (Stage 2), developing a marketing strategy (Stage 3) and finally entering the market (Stage 4).
